Viewers hail icons' rousing speech

OPRAH Winfrey was yesterday tipped to run for US President following her inspiring speech at the Golden Globes.

Her tirade on equality brought a standing ovation from the audience. The icon, 63, who became the first black female to win

the Cecil B DeMille Lifetime Achievement Award, addressed the issues of sexual harassment, racial injustice and press freedom. She told the A-list crowd a "new day is on the horizon". It came as many female stars wore black as a show of support for the #MeToo movement - a rallying cry

against abuse that started in Hollywood. Two of Oprah's close friends later said that she was "actively thinking" about running for president. Her long-term partner Stedman Graham, 66, said: "It's up to the people. She would absolutely do it." And screen legend Meryl Streep, 68, added: "I want

her to run for president. I don't think she had any intention, but now she doesn't have a choice." Oprah's speech was widely praised on social media, but critics branded her a hypocrite as they posted pictures of her kissing alleged abuser Harvey Weinstein.

OPRAH'S SPEECH

In 1964, I was a little girl watching Anne Bancroft present the Oscar for best actor at the 36th Academy Awards. She opened the envelope and said five words that made history: "The winner is Sidney Poitier." I had never seen a black man being celebrated like that.

In 1982, Sidney received the Cecil B. DeMille award at the Golden Globes and it is not lost on me that there are some little girls watching as I become the first black woman to be given this same award. It is an honour to share the evening with them and also with the incredible men and women who have made my journey to this stage possible.

I'm especially proud of all the women who have felt strong enough to share their personal stories.

But it's not just a story affecting the entertainment industry. So I want to express gratitude to all the women who have endured years of abuse because they, like my mother, had children to feed and bills to pay and dreams to pursue.

And there's someone else: Reyc Taylor. In 1944, Reyc Taylor was a young mother walking home from a church service in Abbeville, Alabama, when she was abducted by six armed white men, raped, and left blindfolded by the road. The men were never persecuted. Reyc Taylor died ten days ago, just shy of her 98th birthday. For too long, women have not been heard if they dare speak the truth to the power of those men. But their time is up.

I just hope that Reyc Taylor died knowing that her truth goes marching on. It's here with every woman who chooses to say, "Me too." And every man who chooses to listen.

So I want all the girls watching to know that a new day is on the horizon! And when that new day dawns, it will be because of a lot of magnificent women fighting hard to make sure that they become the leaders who take us to the time when nobody ever has to say "Me too" again.
