Module II: Italy and English Literature: an introduction

This module aims to introduce students to explore the crucial role that Italy had for centuries in British cultural imagination, and specifically in English literature of the Nineteenth and Twentieth centuries, where an extraordinary number of authors and works were inspired by Italian culture and landscape. A selection of texts from different genres and modes – novel, travelogue, poetry, Gothic, Romantic, mid-Victorian, Edwardian and contemporary - will consider how English writers responded to the aesthetic, artistic and intellectual stimulation exerted by Italy and its heritage in different ways over time and how they contributed to a long-lasting cultural construction of Italy through literature. The module will depart from Ann Radcliffe's influential stereotypical vision and word-painting of Italy, then consider examples of Romantic and Victorian Italy in Byron's construction of the myth of Venice, Dickens's perceptive travelogue and Browning's recreation of the Renaissance in his dramatic monologues. E.M. Forster's A Room with a View (1908) and Ian Mc Ewan's The Comfort of Strangers (1981) will be examined as two early and late twentieth-century novels that engage with two entirely different visions of Italian iconic cities (Florence and Venice) and with the complex the idea of the modern tourist.

Further critical references, also to figurative arts and cinema, may be provided during the course module.
