HERE ARE SOME EXAMPLES OF PHRASAL VERBS WITH <u>"PUT"</u>

PUT ASIDE: 1) to ignore or disregard

- These are precisely the kinds of friendships FIRST Global founder Dean Kamen, an inventor, hoped to build — ones that crossed languages, cultures and geopolitical frontiers. His lofty vision is one in which graduates of this program **put aside** politics to solve the world's most pressing challenges. (*Washington Post*)

- All over the world, when people dance together, we celebrate our connectivity and showcase our individuality. In these moments, differences are **put aside** and all that matters is each other and the beat. Let's live how we dance. Let's #LiveInLevis

2) to save something (especially money)

PUT AWAY: to put back things in their places

It could be time for a more drastic tactic to get your children **to put away** all their stuff. One mom's solution: "Fucket Buckets." (*Lifehacker*)

PUT BACK: to return an object to the location where it came from

PUT DOWN: to put to death, because of old age or illness

PUT FORWARD: to propose, to suggest

Cllr Kieron Williams from Southwark Council shared insight into some of the local area's specific challenges, including food poverty, while FareShare and The Trussell Trust **put forward** their views on what works well about our existing partnerships and what we can learn from them.

PUT FORTH: to propose

In 2015, we **put forth** our White House American Business Act on Climate Change Pledge, which outlined commitments that help address climate change through specific actions on issues such as deforestation, beef production and energy used in McDonald's restaurants. (*McDonald's*)

PUT OFF: to make a bad impression, discourage

Women **are put off** from applying for jobs in male dominated industries because of "restrictive" application forms, a top business chief has said. (*BBC*)

TO PUT ON: to apply

In your request, please make clear what information you would like to have changed, whether you would like to have the information that you have provided to us suppressed from our database, or otherwise let us know what limitations you would like **to put on** our use of the information that you have provided to us. (*Tesla*)

PUT OUT: to publish

Merck is working to help make sure that the information our company **puts out** into the world is very clear. Merck's commitment to improving health literacy [...] (*Merck*)

PUT UP WITH: to tolerate
