5 Ws AND 1 H OF JOURNALISM

ABOUT THE RESEARCH

- Who did the research?
- What did they find?
- When was the work done/or the result published?
- Where was the work done?
- How was it done?
- Why was it done? What is the significance of the research and its findings?
- (**So what?**) Why is this research relevant for society (or for a specific audience)?



NEWS VALUES

NOVELTY PROXIMITY EMOTION CONFLICTS

IMPACT TIMELINESS STORIES/PEOPLE

IN GENERAL

What's the news (If there is one...)?

- What's the story/topic/problem?
- What's the impact?
- What's the application?
- What's your opinion about...?
- Are there some critical issues?

SOME ADVICE

SELECT YOUR "TALKING POINTS" BEFORE THE INTERVIEW (AND FOCUS ON THOSE)

AND

STRESS THE NEWS VALUES and try to find the news angle



YOU ARE NOT TALKING WITH or FOR YOUR COLLEAGUES

(MAKE IT SIMPLE, IF YOU CAN)



THE MORE YOU GO INTO DETAILS, THE HIGHER THE RISK OF CUT OR MISTAKES

SELECT YOUR MESSAGES



REPEAT THE MAIN POINTS



DON'T KEEP IT DISTANT

ADD SOME NICE DETAILS, IF YOU CAN



ON TV AVOID BUSY PATTERNS like stripes or polka dots



BLOCKING AND BRIDGING



KEEP THEM SHORT (BUT NOT TOO SHORT)

DON'T SPEAK FAST

DON'T BE BORING
