Objectives

- Know the main characteristics of the international agreements concerning agri-food sector.
- Understand the role play by the agricultural sector in the economic grow.
- Understand the main trends of the international agrifood markets.

- APPLYING KNOWLEDGE AND UNDERSTANDING:
 - Know how to analyze the economic trend of the international agri-food system.
 - Know how to apply the main basic economic and statistical analytical tools to the international agrifood trends.

MAKING JUDGEMENTS:

Students have to demonstrate - at the end of the course - that they have not only memorized the concepts but they have to be able to carry out an autonomous critical analysis of specific case studies.

COMMUNICATION SKILLS:

The preparation of a written report on a case study and its presentation aims at verifying the student's ability to communicate in written and oral terms effectively and with disciplinary lexicon properties the concepts learned during the course.

LEARNING SKILLS:

At the end of the course, a student must demonstrate that he/she can apply the minimum knowledge and understanding descripted in this syllabus by conducting an independent study work on a case study.
