Terrorism Act 2000

Chapter 11

An Act to make provision about terrorism; and to make temporary provision for Northern Ireland about the prosecution and punishment of certain offences, the preservation of peace and the maintenance of order.

[20th July 2000]

BE IT ENACTED by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:-

PART I
INTRODUCTORY

Terrorism: interpretation.

- 1.- (1) In this Act "terrorism" means the use or threat of action where-
 - (a) the action falls within subsection (2),
 - (b) the use or threat is designed to influence the government or an international governmental organisation or to intimidate the public or a section of the public, and
 - (c) the use or threat is made for the purpose of advancing a political, religious or ideological cause.
- (2) Action falls within this subsection if it-
 - (a) involves serious violence against a person,
 - (b) involves serious damage to property,
 - (c) endangers a person's life, other than that of the person committing the action,
 - (d) creates a serious risk to the health or safety of the public or a section of the public, or
 - (e) is designed seriously to interfere with or seriously to disrupt an electronic system.
- (3) The use or threat of action falling within subsection (2) which involves the use of firearms or explosives is terrorism whether or not subsection (1)(b) is satisfied.
- (4) In this section-
 - (a) "action" includes action outside the United Kingdom,
 - (b) a reference to any person or to property is a reference to any person or to property, wherever situated,
 - (c) a reference to the public includes a reference to the public of a country other than the United Kingdom, and
 - (d) "the government" means the government of the United Kingdom, or a Part of the United Kingdom or of a country other than the United Kingdom.
- (5) In this Act a reference to action taken for the purposes of terrorism includes a reference to action taken for the benefit of a proscribed organisation.

RECITALS The Principal manufactures and sells [description of products] and now wishes to appoint the Agent as its exclusive agent for the promotion and sale of those products within the Territory, as defined below.

OPERATIVE PROVISIONS

2. Appointment

2.1. The Principal hereby appoints the Agent as its sole agent to promote and sell the Products in the Territory on the terms of this Agreement and the Agent hereby accepts the appointment on those terms.

3. Agent's obligations

The Agent undertakes and agrees with the Principal at all times during the term of this Agreement:

3.4. To use its best endeavours to promote and sell the Products in the Territory with all due care and diligence, to seek to improve the Principal's goodwill in the Territory, and (but only on the Principal's standard terms and conditions of sale unless specifically authorised otherwise by the Principal under clause 4) without prior reference to the Principal to negotiate, conclude and enter into contracts for the sale of the Products in the name of and on behalf of the Principal.

23. Governing law and jurisdiction

This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with English law and each party hereby irrevocably submits to the jurisdiction of the English Courts.
