
themselves. So, usually a personalized military regime is the first step to consolidate er.

Ailitary one-party regimes by rule draw their selectorate from both the army and the oritarian party. In consequence, the presence of a political party allows the selectorate e more inclusive and gives it an instrument to co-opt opposition. Internal splits might, ever, lead to the disintegration of the regime, especially if the party tries to gain control the military. The dataset of Hadenius and Teorell shows that on global level, the military lly has the upper hand in such conflicts (Hadenius & Teorell, 2006: 19). These regimes lly become personal already during their military regime phase. The (now persona-.) army then creates its own party afterwards (for instance Mobutu in Congo/Zaire) pand the dictator's patronage networks and consolidate power. With a big selectorate which he can hand pick loyal supporters, the dictator can use divide-and-rule strateto minimize internal opposition, in order to concentrate on external threats.
