Learning objectives

Knowledge and understanding:

At the end of the course, students will be able to understand the main ideas of historical academic texts (written/oral), extrapolate important points and express ideas about them orally and in writing.

Applying knowledge and understanding:

At the end of the course, students will be able to interact both orally and in writing about academic and common everyday topics as well as produce simple and complex academic texts using appropriate register in English.

Making judgements:

At the end of the course, students will be able to apply tools they have developed both in and outside class for effective problem-solving.

Communication skills:

At the end of the course, students will be able to express their ideas and opinions in a natural, spontaneous and detailed way as well as understand and report on ideas shared by others.

Learning skills:

During the course, students will have many opportunities to acquire learning tools for oral and written comprehension and expression.

Prerequisites

B1 level according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages

Contents

Tools and strategies for speaking: pronunciation, fluency exercises, and specific vocabulary for historical studies as well as conversation exercises and oral presentations. In addition, an important component of the course focuses on clear and effective writing in English. Course content will be adapted and modified to meet the needs of the group in order to best achieve the objectives of the course.

Teaching format

Interactive lessons in English. Listening and reading, speaking and writing exercises to develop all skills related to language learning.

End-of-course test

At the end of the course there will be a 4-part exam.

- 1) English usage: multiple choice 25%
- 2) Reading Comprehension: Multiple choice 25%
- 3) Essay: 25%
- 4) Oral Expression: Students will create a brief video with appropriate answers to one or more questions in English. 25%

Final results are based on a 30-point scale with a passing grade of 18/30.
