Here is what we did today.

Free Write 1. (5 minutes). What's on your mind plus partner discussion.

Free Write 2. React to your reading (10 minutes).

Use this free write as an opportunity to process what you read. What did you learn from this writing? What concepts did you remember? Did anything come back to you because you were writing? Did you make any connections or figure anything out because you wrote about it?

Read your free write out loud (get used to this).

Discuss in groups of three.

Where did your free write bring you? Did you figure anything out that you didn't know as a result of your writing?

What discussion questions come up for you when thinking about the writing you did for this week.

Group discussion and wrap up.
