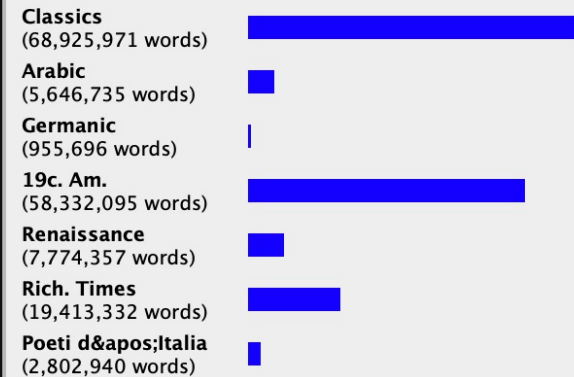

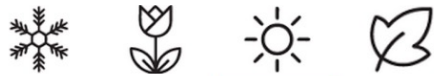


Route Network Flow

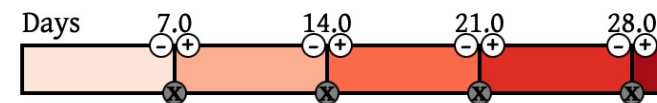

The *Epigraphic Database Heidelberg* contains the texts of **Latin and bilingual** (i.e. Latin-Greek) **inscriptions of the Roman Empire**. The epigraphic monuments are collected and kept up to date on the basis of modern research. With the help of search functions specific queries can be carried out - e.g. a search for words in inscriptions and / or particular descriptive data. The search results are often displayed together with photos and drawings.

The geographic focus is provided by the provinces of the Roman Empire. The total number of records rises continuously.

The Research Project is made up of three constituent databases

- ↗ Bibliographic Database (↗ last update)

The information presented on these indexed pages has been summarized from the superb reference work *The Roman Inscriptions of Britain - Vol.I Inscriptions on Stone* by Prof. R.G. Collingwood and R.P. Wright (Oxford 1965).

In the RBO version the following information is presented; the *R.I.B.* designation number and observed Latin text, the nature and condition of medium, the date and place of its discovery, its current whereabouts - whether in a museum, private collection, still *in situ*, lost, destroyed, etc. - the date of the inscription, where it may be ascertained, also whether the text has been restored. In addition, all of the place-name headings on the linked pages are clickable, and lead to separate pages on each location where many of the inscriptions have been translated. All translations are, however, the work of the RBO WebMaster, Togodumnus, upon whom all blame should be laid for any inherent mistakes.

Summary of 'Critical Signs' Used in RBO Version

- - symbol used as separator to indicate text on different parts of stone
- ... - indicates an entire line of text either indecipherable or missing
- ...xxx - indicates text missing on left of line or word, of any length
- xxx... - indicates text missing on right
- ...xxx... - indicates text missing on both sides
- xxx...xxx - indicates text missing in middle
- [xxx] - indicates text deliberately deleted in antiquity but easily restored

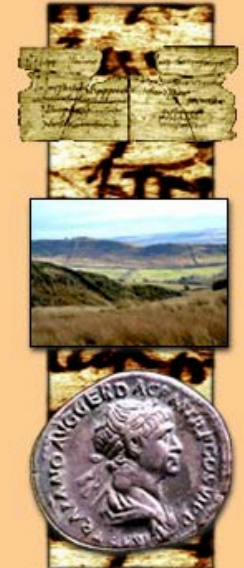
